What is domestic violence?

Threatening, coercive or controlling behaviour that occur in current or former family, domestic or intimate relationships.

Definition of domestic violence

It encompasses:

- Physical abuse;
- Sexual abuse;
- Emotional & psychological abuse;
- Economic control;
- Social isolation; and
- Any other behaviour that may cause a person to live in fear

Physical abuse

Sheela says that "[her] husband has been physically abusive." Her solution is to avoid him - that's what her parents tell her to do. They do not intervene when he hits her.

Yvonne's husband recently threatened to kill himself in front of Yvonne and their children. Now that her husband is going to be home full time, Yvonne is scared and at a loss for what to do.

Using technology to exert control

Yu Wei reported that her abuser controls her activities by setting curfews for her and her children. He locks the door to the house if they are not home by the curfew. At home, he also controls their use of wi-fi, air-con and other technology.


